Pebble Beach Golf Links

Location: Pebble Beach, California

Length: 7,040 yards

Par: 72

Pebble Beach Golf Links is the number 1 ranked public golf course in the world. It was designed by Jack Neville & Douglas Grant. This course includes nine holes perched immediately above the crashing pacific surf with the Amen Corner and a few Hail Mary's thrown over an ocean cove.



Muirfield Village – New Course

Location: Dublin, Ohio

Length: 7,352 yards

Par: 72

Muirfield Village Golf Club was designed by Jack Nicklaus. The final five holes at Muirfield Village embody Nicklaus' credo: Hard, fair, and picturesque. This course to challenge the serious golfers and offer a pleasant golf experience to the casual player.



TPC Sawgrass

Location: Ponte Vedra Beach, Florida

Length: 7,245 yards

Par: 72

TPC Sawgrass is known for hosting THE PLAYERS. The challenging layout is routed so that no two consecutive holes ever play in the same direction. With traditional Scottish link-style bunkers, sandy waste areas, and water hazards that come into play on every hole makes this course even more interesting. And don't forget the famous No. 17 Island green.



Old Course at St. Andrews

Location: St. Andrews, Scotland

Length: 6,721 yards

Par: 72

Old Course at St. Andrews is the oldest and most iconic golf course in the world. This course remains a public golf course, open to all. The Swilcan Bridge and Hell Bunker are recognized across the globe.



Spyglass Hill Golf Course

Location: Pebble Beach, California **Length:** 6,953 yards **Par:** 72

Spyglass Hill Golf Course was designed by Robert Trent Jones Sr. and distinguished as the toughest test of golf on the Peninsula. The first five holes are played along the coastal dunes with huge open vistas of the Pacific. From #7 on the course transforms into the Del Monte Forest.



TPC Scottsdale

Location: Scottsdale, Arizona **Length:** 7,261 yards **Par:** 71

TPC Scottsdale is a classic desert-style course with sweeping views of mountain vistas. Expect lush fairways, well-manicured bunkers, and fast greens. The most famous hole at TPC Scottsdale is the par-3 on hole sixteen, known as the Coliseum.



PGA National

Location: Palm Beach Gardens, Florida **Length:** 7,045 yards **Par:** 71

The PGA National was designed by Thomas Fazio and then redesigned by Jack Nicklaus in 2014. This course contains the infamous three-hole stretch appropriately named “The Bear Trap”. Routinely one of the toughest courses on tour, this course is a true ball-striking test.



Torrey Pines South

Location: San Diego, California **Length:** 7,707 yards **Par:** 72

Torrey Pines South was originally designed by William Bell Sr. and most recently redesigned by Rees Jones. Golfers must also deal with the distributive view of hang-gliders and para-gliders, soaring and hovering at the edge of the cliffs on the south end of the course.



Castle Course at St. Andrews

Location: St. Andrews, Scotland **Length:** 6,759 yards **Par:** 71

The Castle Course at St. Andrews was designed by David McLay Kidd. The Castle course follows the coastlines east of St. Andrews and is just two miles from the center of town. The Castle course is a perfect to the Trust’s other six golf courses, with outstanding scenery and a challenging level of play.



Quivira

Location: Cabo San Lucas, Mexico **Length:** 7,085 yards **Par:** 72

This course was designed by Jack Nicklaus. Quivira Golf Club sits at the tip of the Baja Peninsula, offering panoramic views of the Pacific. The unique terrain provides the ideal setting for golf with windswept dunes and rocky cliffs. The Par-3 sixth hole is famous for its cliff top green that was carved from the base of a massive dune.



Twin Eagles

Location: Naples, Florida **Length:** 7,634 yards **Par:** 71

Twin Eagles was designed by Jack Nicklaus. Twin Eagles offers terrific views and challenging play for golfers at every skill level. There are several sparkling lakes throughout with tremendous amounts of wildlife that only being on the edge of a Florida Preserve can offer you.



TPC River Highlands

Location: Cromwell, Connecticut **Length:** 6,841 yards **Par:** 70

TPC River Highlands is home to the Travelers Championship and was designed by Pete Dye. This course is known for its tree-lined bent grass playing corridors skirting a number of water hazards along the way. Holes 15 to 17 are some of the most aquatically challenging holes on the pro circuit.



Kingswood Golf Club

Location: Victoria, Australia **Length:** 6,082 yards **Par:** 72

Kingswood Golf Course is located in Melbourne's famous Sandbelt golf region. Firm and fast with tilted greens, expansive bunkers, wide fairways and roughs that combine sand, native grasses and heathland vegetation that the Sandbelt region is known for.



TPC Boston

Location: Boston, Massachusetts **Length:** 7,216 yards **Par:** 73

TPC Boston was designed by Arnold Palmer. This course is known for its lush fairways bent grass greens and 64 bunkers. With 5 sets of tees this course is perfect for any level of golfer.



TPC Southwind

Location: Memphis, Tennessee **Length:** 7,244 yards **Par:** 70

TPC Southwind was designed by Ron Prichard. Water comes into play on more than half the holes causing a very strong test for the professional players. The layout features rolling zoysia fairways and champion Bermuda greens, with numerous lakes and streams.



TPC Potomac

Location: Potomac, Maryland **Length:** 7,139 yards **Par:** 70

This course was designed by Tom Fazio and Pete Dye as well as a few PGA Tour pro like Fred Funk and Davis Love III. The Rock Run Creek runs along five of the holes on the back nine, adding to the course's natural beauty.



TPC Summerlin

Location: Las Vegas, Nevada **Length:** 7,243 yards **Par:** 72

This rugged desert terrain was designed by Bobby Weed. The golf course meanders through arroyos and canyons. The result is one of the most visually stunning tests of golf in Nevada.



Links at Spanish Bay

Location: Pebble Beach, California **Length:** 6,754 yards **Par:** 72

Links at Spanish Bay was designed by Robert Trent Jones Jr., Tom Watson, and Frank "Sandy" Tatum. This course is a Scottish-style linksland course, from the rolling fairways, white sand dunes and gusting winds to the plaintive strains of the bagpipe that signals the end of each day's play.



Great Northern

Location: Kerteminde, Denmark **Length:** 6,754 yards **Par:** 72

This was Jack Nicklaus first golf course in Denmark to design. The most unique aspect of this course are the relative positions of the holes, with the factor of winds that can change the personality and playability of the course on a daily basis.



St. Andrews Jubilee

Location: St. Andrews, Scotland **Length:** 6,742 yards **Par:** 72

This course was designed by Donald Steel. The Jubilee plays on a narrow strip of links land, wedged between the New Course and St. Andrews Bay. Some of the holes thread their way through low sand dunes.



St. Andrews New Course

Location: St. Andrews, Scotland **Length:** 6,625 yards **Par:** 71

The New Course was designed by Old Tom Morris and Benjamin Hall Blyth an Edinburgh engineer. The New course is often referred to as the local's favourite because it is tighter and more defined than the old.



Prairie Dunes

Location: Hutchinson, Kansas **Length:** 6,759 yards **Par:** 70

This course was designed by Perry Maxwell for the first nine holes and then by his son Press Maxwell for the last 9 holes. Prairie Dunes is a link-style course with rolling hills reminiscent of the seaside courses of Scotland. It is also ranked among the best courses in the United States.



Torrey Pines North

Location: San Diego, California **Length:** 7,258 yards **Par:** 72

Torrey Pines North course was renovated by Tom Weiskopf and is the host to the PGA Tour's Farmer Insurance Open. The North course is a more scenic experience than the south, with more picture-perfect opportunities along the track. The north is bordered on its north end by the Torrey Pines State Reserve.



TPC Deere Run

Location: Silvis, Illinois **Length:** 7,066 yards **Par:** 71

TPC Deer Run was designed by D.A. Weibring and is host to the John Deere Classic. There are elevation changes, great views, scenery, and the Rock River complemented with small ponds and deep ravines. Some the golf's greatest names have found themselves seriously challenged by the risk-reward layout.



The Hay (Short course)

Location: Pebble Beach, California **Length:** 670 yards **Par:** 27

The Hay is an executive style course and was designed by Tiger Woods. The Hay features plaques on every tee to commemorate famous golfers who have made their marks at Pebble Beach Resorts. The most notable holes is the second hole, created as an exact replica of the famous 7th hole on Pebble Beach Golf Links.



TPC Twin Cities

Location: Blaine, Minnesota **Length:** 7,513 yards **Par:** 72

TPC Twin Cities was designed by the legendary golfer Arnold Palmer and home to the 3M Open. With Palmer's signature beach bunker on the seventh hole, elevated greens and four expansive native area bunkers add to the unique character and strategic diversity of this course.



Los Altos Golf & CC

Location: Los Altos, California **Length:** 6,505 yards **Par:** 71

Los Altos was designed by Tom Nicoll and known as one of the most beautiful, challenging, and well-maintained golf courses in the Bay Area. The picturesque setting with the Santa Cruz Mountain Coastal Range as a backdrop its breath taking.



The Bridges

Location: Rancho Santa Fe, California **Length:** 7,002 yards **Par:** 71

The Bridges is a signature Robert Trent Jones II designed course. This course is nestled within the coastal crest and canyons of Rancho Santa Fe. This course is also home to one of the most photographed holes in the country.



The Bears Club

Location: Jupiter, Florida **Length:** 7,164 yards **Par:** 71

The Bears Club was designed specifically by Jack Nicklaus. The layout exudes a low country feel as it moves through a property rich in native vegetation, old oaks, pines, cypress trees and wetland areas.



The Farms

Location: Rancho Santa Fe, California **Length:** 6,850 yards **Par:** 72

The Farms golf course was designed by Tommy Jacobs who was the youngest player to be invited to The Masters for 58 years as well as Tom Lehman. This is a challenging course with holes dotted among the carefully crafted, narrow fairways.



Twin Dolphin

Location: Los Cabos, Mexico **Length:** 7,156 yards **Par:** 72

Twin Dolphin was designed by a collaboration of both Todd Eckenrode and professional golfer Fred Couples. This course is laid out on high terraced terrain overlooking the coastline, with fairways routed along and across rugged arroyos, bounded by native vegetation and rock formations, and there are fabulous ocean views to enjoy on almost every hole.



Dismal River - Red

Location: Mullen, Nebraska **Length:** 6,994 yards **Par:** 71

Dismal River, Red Course was designed by Tom Doak. The most well-known hole on this course is hole eighteen that delivers breathtaking vistas of the clubhouse, cabins and 400-foot sand dunes overlooking the river itself.



Dismal River - White

Location: Mullen, Nebraska **Length:** 7,353 yards **Par:** 72

Dismal River, White Course was designed by Jack Nicklaus with magnificent views in every direction. This course is known for its unique routing through the sand dunes of Nebraska.



TPC Craig Ranch

Location: McKinney, Texas

Length: 7,438 yards

Par: 72

TPC Craig Ranch was designed by Tom Weiskopf and is now host to the AT&T Byron Nelson tournament. One of the main features of this course is Rowlett Creek which crosses through the course 14 times throughout.



TPC Louisiana

Location: Avondale, Louisiana

Length: 7,399 yards

Par: 72

TPC Louisiana was designed by Pete Dye and this course is home to the Zurich Classic even on the PGA Tour. This course is part of the Audubon Golf Trail, featuring 250 acres of wetlands along the Mississippi River delta. The golf course finishes with its signature hole, a tough par 5 with water along the entire right side.



TPC San Antonio

Location: San Antonio, Texas

Length: 7,435 yards

Par: 72

TPC San Antonio was designed by Greg Norman. This is a lengthy course with sheer-faced limestone walls facing some of the holes. The layout features large, rolling greens and tree-lined fairways.



Bluejack National

Location: Montgomery, Texas

Length: 7,318 yards

Par: 72

Bluejack National was the first Tiger Woods designed course in the United States. This course contains no rough which means there are wide landing areas. Many say this course was inspired by Augusta National.



Buffalo Ridge

Location: Hollister, Missouri

Length: 7,036 yards

Par: 71

Buffalo Ridge has a reputation as one of the top public golf courses in the country. This course was designed by Tom Fazio who incorporated all of the Ozark features into this golf course. There also are a few multi-tiered greens to watch out for.



El Cardonal

Location: Cabo San Lucas, Mexico

Length: 7,363 yards

Par: 72

El Cardonal is a Tiger Woods designed course, which he styled after the old-style southern California courses. The golf course enjoys dramatic, long-range views of the Pacific and the landscape has everything from natural dunes and arroyos to mature vegetation, providing the perfect canvas for golf. El Cardonal is a golf course that places emphasis on strategy over strength.



Payne's Valley

Location: Hollister, Missouri

Length: 7,370 yards

Par: 72

This is the first publicly designed course by Tiger Woods. Payne's Valley features wide fairways, broad earth shaping and over 450 feet of elevation change. The green surrounds are designed to promote creativity and a variety of recovery options.



Payne's Valley – Hole 19

Location: Hollister, Missouri

Length: 136 yards

Par: 3

At most courses at the 19th hole, you grab a beer, at Payne's Valley you grab a club. This hole is a visual exclamation point on an already memorable layout. Ending at an island green guarded by a front bunker in Lunker Lake. Don't be distracted by the waterfall spilling off a 250-foot rock cliff that frames the hole like an amphitheater.



The Dunes

Location: Kahului, Hawaii

Length: 6,841 yards

Par: 72

The Dunes was designed by Robin Nelson and has a distinct links feel to it. All fairways are routed in either a northwest or southeast direction which means the prevailing winds cut across the holes adding an additional difficulty.



Top of the Rock

Location: Hollister, Missouri

Length: 1,420

Par: 27

This is the first par 3 course ever built by Jack Nicklaus. This course is set high above Table Rock Lake and offers pristine views in the midst of naturally preserved golfing conditions.



Valley of the Eagles

Location: Haines, Alaska

Length: 2,997 yards

Par: 36

This course is very unique as it is located on tidelands that are occasionally covered by high tides. The greens are made of artificial turf to avoid toxic materials in this sensitive area and to provide a longer playing season. This course is a links style and moose, and bears frequent the area.



Wade Hampton

Location: Cashiers, North Carolina

Length: 7,302 yards

Par: 72

This course is a Tom Fazio masterpiece. Wade Hampton is classified as a mountain course and is considered the best in the country. Wade Hampton has slick, undulating greens and tight fairways.



The Club at Pasadera

Location: Monterey, California **Length:** 6,801 yards **Par:** 71

Pasadera is the only Jack Nicklaus course on the famed Monterey Peninsula. Hole 15 at one time was the longest par 4 in North America. Hole 14 is breath taking with the visual distraction of a canyon at your feet and the view across the way stretching to Monterey and the Pacific Grove.



The Oasis at Diamante

Location: Cabo San Lucas, Mexico **Length:** 1,124 yards **Par:** 36

The Oasis at Diamante is a 12-hole short course, designed by Tiger Woods. This course is grassed entirely with Bermuda grass and provides golfers a true oasis in the open desert landscape. The holes are routed around a pristine lake, surrounded by palms and lush, colourful vegetation.



Mountain Top at Big Cedar Lodge

Location: Hollister, Missouri **Length:** 1,927 yards **Par:** 39

Mountain Top at Big Cedar Lodge was designed by Bass Pro Shops founder, and conservationist Jonny Morris and World Golf Hall of Fame legend Gary Player. A short, 13-hole course is intertwined through unforgettable rock formations, including some of the most dramatic views in the Ozarks.
